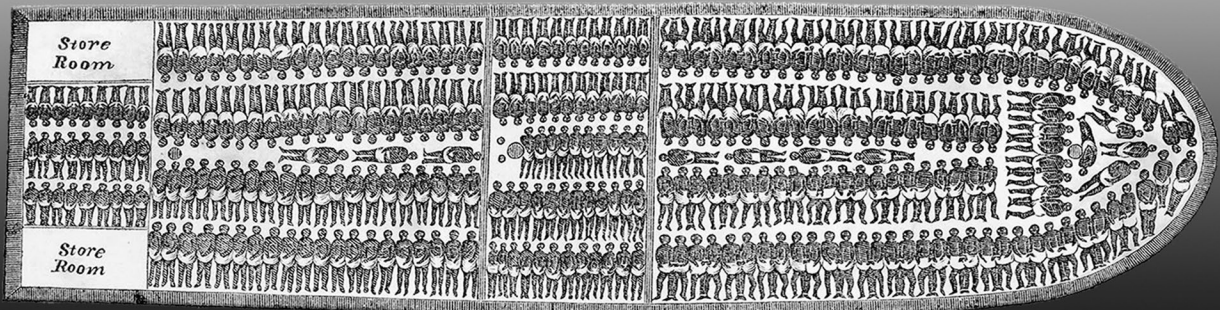
Come see the award-winning documentary "The Durban 400" which recounts the unprecedented organizing by Black led NGOs that helped produce the historic Durban Declaration and Program of Action at the 2001 UN World Conference Against Racism. This fast-moving documentary is a primer on how an organized grouping of civil society organizations can impact the United Nations to produce an unprecedented result – the first international declaration that the Trans-Atlantic Slave Trade and Slavery were Crimes Against Humanity and that Reparations are due the descendants of the victims of these crimes.

With the advent of the Permanent Forum on People of African Descent, the issue of reparations for PAD still remains unresolved around the world. The Durban Declaration and Program of Action is key to that demand and to the success of the PFPAD.

Following the screening, presentations will be made by Mr. David Comissiong, Barbados' Ambassador to CARICOM who was involved in the DDPA negotiations in Durban and with CARICOM's Reparations Commission; Attorney Efia Nwangaza, of the Malcolm X Center for Self-Determination, who participated in the 2001 Durban Conference and at the first session of the PFPAD last December in Geneva. The session will be emceed by human rights attorney Roger Wareham who participated in all stages of the Durban WCAR and its followups and was a lead attorney in a 2002 national class action reparations lawsuit in the U.S.
